



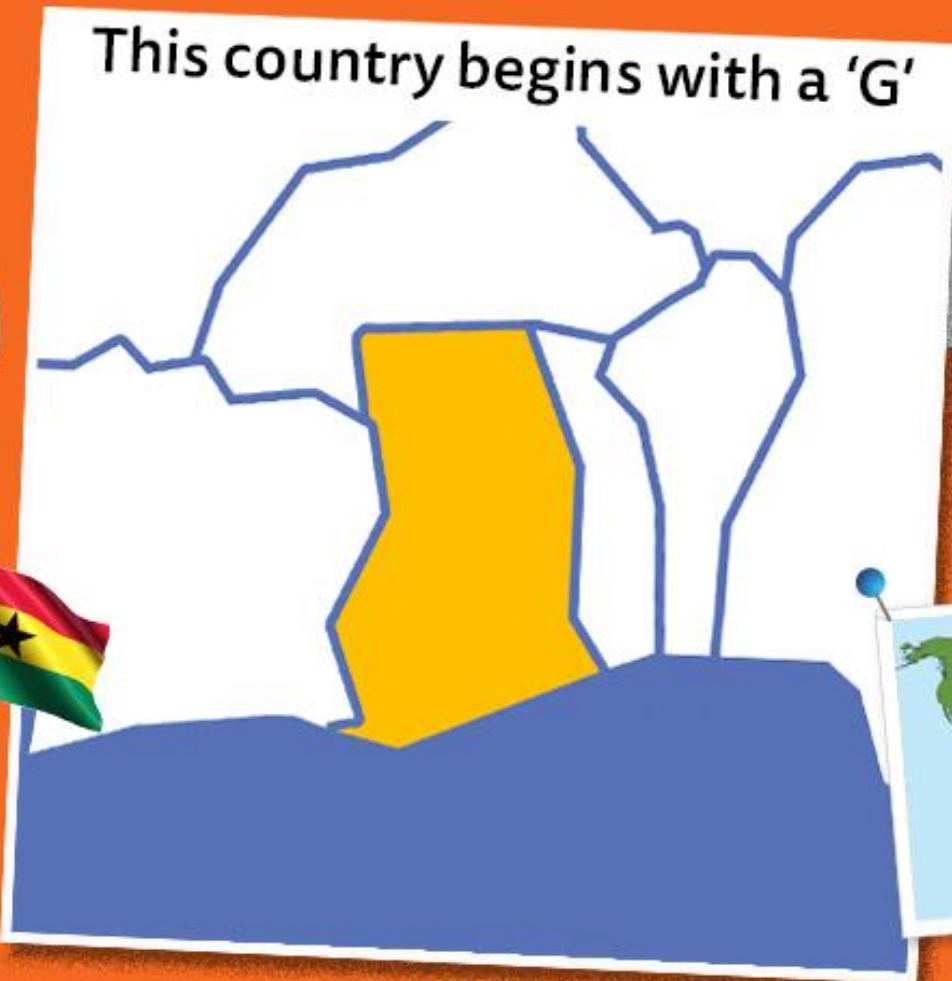
The world this week
