Where are we this week?

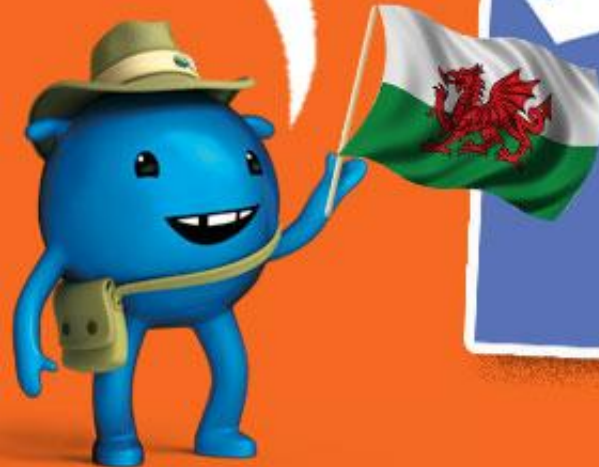
This country begins with a 'W'

Its capital city is Cardiff.

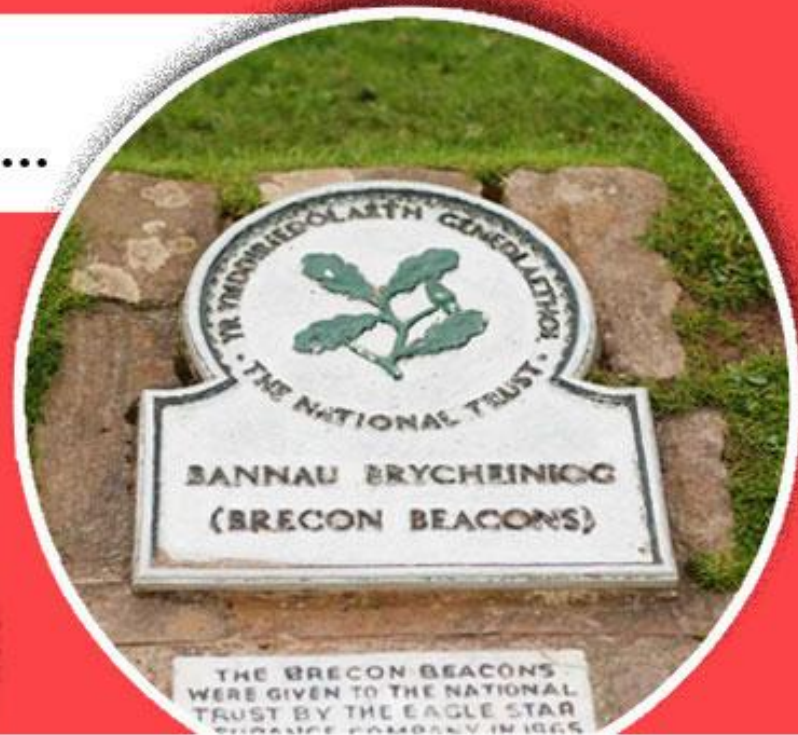
