These things could change. In one Indian state, Kerala, 97% of people can read and write. It does not matter how much money someone has, or whether they are a girl or a boy — the state wants everyone to be able to go to school. Other states could follow Kerala's example.

As India's population and economy grows, it could become one of the most powerful countries in the world.
