Records in the British Newspaper Archive offer a snapshot of some vanished careers.

As tech bosses debate whether AI will make some jobs **obsolete**, here are a few of the fascinating things we used to do for a living.

#### **Snuffed out**

It used to take 25,000 people to light London's lamps. Now lamplighters are all but extinct. But a few still turn up at dusk to light the historic gas lamps

#### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Humans have always had to work, but they haven't always had jobs. The earliest records we have of people being paid to work are from about 5,000 years ago. One early form of payment was salt. The word salary, meaning pay, comes from the Roman word for salt.

#### Knocker up

Before alarm clocks, we had knocker ups. Someone would come to your door and wake you up to make sure you weren't late. No snooze button back then!

#### Rag and bone man

Before recycling, people sold their old clothes to the rag and bone man, who would collect rubbish and hope to sell it on for a profit.

#### **Crossing sweeper**

Back before tarmac, and when horse droppings were a common sight on the roads, a crossing sweeper would clean the street for a small fee.

#### Mudlark

Meanwhile mudlarks would dredge the rivers, looking for rubbish worth saving from the water.

#### **Chimney sweep**

And when everyone had a coal fire, chimney sweeps would climb up them to clean. This was a hard job, and like many back then, it was done by children!
