May Day is upon us, and people are celebrating summer coming in the same ways they have for centuries.

Cuckoo calling

The cuckoo has nearly started singing. It only does this for a few weeks, starting in May. In Britain, the cuckoo announces the summer, and a special holiday. It's May Day!

At the heart of May Day celebrations stands the maypole.

As you'd expect this is a pole. were **blasphemous**.



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

May Day has been celebrated as the first day of summer around Europe for a long time. The ancient Romans, who gave the month its name, held a festival called Floralia. In ancient Ireland, a festival called Beltane also marked the beginning of May.

But it's a special pole. For 700 years, people would put one up in their village to dance around.

Long history

You can find maypoles across Europe, including in Germany, Belgium, Sweden, and Denmark. Some people think they have roots going back to Pagan times.

That might be why, in England, maypoles were banned when Oliver Cromwell overthrew King Charles I in 1649. He thought maypoles were blasphemous.

Back around

But you can't keep a good pole down. When King Charles II replaced Cromwell, maypoles were back in fashion. People danced for joy. Some of those dances included Morris dancing, a traditional dance you do with bells on your feet!

May Queen

On May Day, some villages also choose a May Queen, who wears a white gown and leads a parade.
So celebrate the end of spring in style and dance around the maypole!
