Participant criteria

We're looking for students passionate about solving challenges for people and the planet who may not typically have access to opportunities like this.

- **Participants:** 10 students (2 each from five UK schools) aged 7–14 (Years 5–9), reflecting a diversity of views and values.
- **Focus Areas:** Ideally from underserved areas (e.g., Government Levelling Up regions or Arts Council Priority Places).
- **Selection:** Students could be from the School Council, Eco Council, or a group that would benefit most.
- **Submission:** Provide a brief explanation of how your students would benefit.

Participant and School Requirements

- Students and a teacher must be available on key dates.
- Students will complete assignments between events, supported by both us and the school.
- Travel may be required (expenses covered).
- Participants must provide feedback, share ideas, and have parental permission to feature in marketing and media.

Student Benefits

- Enhance CVs and meet like-minded peers.
- Learn through play to create positive change.
- Develop oracy, journalism, advocacy skills, and confidence.
- Receive a certificate of involvement.
- Attend an event where students will have the change to share their ideas with sustainability leaders
- Opportunity for published work.
